Linked in with the sport, co-curricular and wellbeing program, students have the opportunity to participate in weekly trainings, various scheduled sports and external competitions. For those students wanting to progress into higher levels of competition, representing the school in both team and individual categories, IGS participates in the Association of Independent Co-Educational Schools (AICES) and the Combined Independent Schools (CIS) pathway schemes.

All trainings are signed up via the Engage Portal. IGS teams are selected and determined from students at training, with students selected for representative pathways also developed from our training activities. 


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High School Sport Opportunities

IGS School Athletics Carnival

The IGS School Athletics Carnival is a compulsory carnival held every year in Term 2. Students are encouraged to participate in as many events as possible and receive a participation house point for each event entered. The winning house of the carnival is determined from points earned for participation and results from each event. IGS Age Champion medallions will be presented at an assembly after the carnival.



CDSSA Athletics Carnival

CDSSA is the first athletics pathway following the School Carnival. The top two boys and girls in each age group for each event are eligible to compete at CDSSA (except 400m and relay, where four boys and girls will compete).

AICES Athletics Championships

The AICES Championships is the next pathway after CDSSA. The top three boys and girls per event, per age group, are eligible to compete at AICES. If your child would like to nominate to compete in the triple jump event at the AICES Athletics Carnival, please send through their verified distance to the PDHPE Department.

CIS Athletics Championships

The CIS Championships is the next pathway after AICES. The top three boys and girls per event, per age group, are eligible to compete at CIS. If your child would like to nominate to compete in the hurdles event at the CIS Athletics Carnival, please send through their verified time to the PDHPE Department by early September.

Multi Class Events

Athletes with a disability can compete at AICES with the first three places at AICES being nominated to compete at CIS. These places will be decided by Athletics NSW. All multi class athletes must have their classification number provided prior to nomination.

CDSSA Basketball Trials

CDSSA Basketball trialists are selected from school training, with successful players at the trial going on to play for CDSSA at the AICES Championships in either the U15 or Open age groups. IGS will enter 4 teams into the CDSSA Basketball Championships in age groups U15 Boys, U15 Girls, Open Boys and Open Girls. The winning school teams from both the Opens Boys and Open Girls competition will go on to play at the AICES Schools Basketball Cup the following year. Students must attend training to be eligible to be selected to play in an IGS team at the CDSSA Basketball Championships.

CDSSA Cross Country

NSW Regional Futsal Competitions

IGS enters a Junior and Senior Girls team as well as a Senior Mixed team. The winning U15 and Open team at the gala day will then go on to represent CDSSA and IGS at the AICES Schools Championships. The gala day also serves as selection for individual players into the CDSSA U15 and Opens Team. This team then competes at the AICES Championships.

AICES U15 Netball Championships

Venue: Netball Central, Homebush

Players who have been selected to play in the CDSSA team compete at the AICES Netball Championship. AICES selectors then select the top 10 players to go on and play for AICES at CIS.

AICES Open Netball Championships

Players who have been selected to play in the CDSSA team compete at the AICES Netball Championship. AICES selectors then select the top 10 players to go on and play for AICES at CIS.

CDSSA Swimming Carnival

The CDSSA Swimming Carnival is the first swimming pathway following the IGS Swimming Carnival. Each school is guaranteed two swimmers for 50m Freestyle and one swimmer in all other events. If there are spare lanes, swimmers will be allocated based on submitted times.

AICES Swimming Championships

AICES Tennis Cup

CIS Tennis Cup

Date: 28 February Venue: Pymble Ladies College, Pymble One male and one female team from AICES can enter the CIS Tennis Cup. Top male and female team from the AICES Championship will progress into CIS.

AICES U15 Tennis Championship (Individual Pathway)

Nominations Due: 13 November

The AICES U15 Tennis Championships will be open to any tennis player aged 15 years and under that plays a high level of competition Tennis. Interested players must see the PDHPE Office prior to the nomination due date. No late nomination will be accepted.

IGS Sport Code of Conduct

IGS is committed to supporting our students to display the highest level of sportsmanship and respect when competing in all sporting endeavours.

The IGS Sport Code of Conduct is a set of practical guidelines which serves to support our core values of Diversity, Personal Achievement, Connectedness, Vibrancy and Authenticity.

Respect

All participants must:

- Demonstrate the highest level of respect for all participants in all activities. This includes respect for the school, officials, coaches, your team, the opposition, the captain, and spectators.
- Always play in the spirit of the game, abiding by the rules and always respecting the official's final decision in all circumstances.
- Not engage in criticism (sledging) of the opposition, officials, coaches, supporters or a team mate. Retaliation to opposition sledging is not acceptable.
- Not engage in any deliberate acts of violence or serious foul play.
- Not use any foul language in any circumstances.
- Place the interests of your team above your own interests and give your best effort in all circumstances.
- Be punctual to trainings and games.
- Adhere to all dates for completion of transport arrangements & other organisational procedures.

Uniform

It is the expectation that:

- Full IGS Sports Uniform or specific team uniforms will be worn for all sporting events.
- Students should not expect to take part in an event unless they are in full team uniform.

Effort and Behaviour

It is the student's responsibility to:

- Ensure they do not fall behind on any class work missed while representing the school.
- See their teacher prior to their sporting event where possible. The student is responsible for making alternate arrangements with their teacher if the event clashes with an assessment.
- Maintain behaviour in class to an acceptable standard to be considered for selection. Students may be excluded from representing the school if their efforts in class are not satisfactory.

Please note: Any student who does not demonstrate the values outlined in the Code of Conduct will jeopardise future sporting participation. Whilst teams are picked by the respective coaches and selectors the ultimate discretion will remain with the Head of Sport regarding selection of students into teams.
